very best as you commence your journey with us. It was a wonderful feeling to greet our P-10 students last Thursday and our new Kindergarten students this week.











Staff Preparation and Planning and COVID 19 Update

Extensive work was done to ensure all areas of the school were deep cleaned and sanitised before classes commenced. All families would now have received two masks and Rapid Antigen Test Kits for each child enrolled at the College. 


## **URStrong – Our Friendship Focus**

Friendshipsthatlastalifetime! That's what we wantour students to make here at Dominic College. To support our students, we use the URStrong Program as a part of our EMPOWER Program. The URStrong Program as it supports children to

establish and maintain healthy relationships, manage conflict with kindness and increase their overall resilience. There is common language that is utilised in the Program, and you may hear your

child use these words



at home. Children are explicitly taught the skills of friendship, and these are based on the four rules of friendship. This quick glossary will help you understand the language your child may be using.

- Friendship Fire: Any situation between you and a friend that results in negative feelings.
- **Mean-on-Purpose:** When someone is intentionally unkind to someone else.
- Quick Comeback: A very short word or phrase that is used when someone is Mean-on-Purpose. Quick Comebacks are designed to let the other person know that you heard/saw what they did and you're not okay with it.
- Friend-o-Meter: A visual tool that assesses the health of friendships, ranging from the healthy zone to the unhealthy zone.
- Friendship Ninja: A Friendship Ninja is someone who surrounds themselves with friends in the healthy zone of the Friend-o-meter. A Friendship Ninja is kind and friendly to everyone.

We look forward to sharing our URStrong work with you throughout the year, and we encourage you to use this common language with your children at home. ## Student and Parent Support

## **Transition Tips during COVID-19**

In the transition back to school after the summer school holidays with the impact of COVID-19, students are facing some additional challenges returning to school. The summer

holidays may have looked different for families and coming back to school with COVID-19 safe practices, students are dealing with a lot of change and uncertainty.

Here are some suggestions from Seasons for Growth® (<u>mackillopinstitute.org.au</u>) to ease back into this new school year gently.

#### Routine

Start shifting back into a routine, set wake-times, turn off devices an hour before sleep, re-establish breakfast, morning snack and lunch patterns, read books and practice wearing a mask for longer periods (if required).

## **Prepare**

Talk about any pandemic protection measures that will be in place at school so your child knows what to expect. It may be helpful to practice or role-play some of these, such as mask wearing, greeting friends, washing hands or drop-off procedures.

#### Listen and reassure

Give your child opportunities to share any worries and listen carefully to their concerns. Reassure them it is okay to feel nervous and/or worried, but try not to share any of your own anxieties. Encourage positivity by reminding your child about the aspects of the school term they enjoy, such as seeing or making new friends, playing sport or beginning a new activity.

Model trust, both in the school's protection measures and in your child's ability to handle things.

#### Choices

Giving kids choices can help them feel they have some control. Ask if there is anything that would help them (such as meeting a friend or taking a special item in their bag). Get children involved in choosing a healthy breakfast, sharing ideas for what to eat at recess and





lunch, helping pack their bags, preparing any extra masks or other pandemic-related items.

#### Time

Give yourselves extra time in the morning to get ready and get to school. Perhaps play some music you all enjoy at home or in the car. Take a few deep breaths together before your child leaves the house/before they go through the school gate.

## Reconnect

Reconnect over an after school snack or by playing a game together. Acknowledge that some children don't talk much about their school day, but do provide opportunities for them to share any issues. Try asking if they would like to do anything differently for school tomorrow. If necessary, problem-solve the night before so they can sleep easy.

## PARKING SAFELY AT DROP OFF AND PICK UP TIMES

- The staff only park has been put in place to free up as many spaces in the parking aisles as possible. Please use these parking aisles if you wish to leave your car do not park in the staff car park.






