Year 9 and 10 Exam Week - Mr Casni's Top 5 Tips

We wish all our Year 9 and 10 students all the very best as they undertake their Yearly Exams next week. Students and teachers have been busily revising and preparing for these final assessment tasks. It is great seeing students completing past exam papers to gain important feedback, preparing flashcards (study cards) to summarise key ideas, concepts and examples, and asking helpful questions of their teachers to be best prepared for these exams.

My Top 5 Tips for all students as they commence their exams is to:

- Get a good night's sleep before each exam and have some breakfast each morning before the exam.
- Read all questions carefully and use the mark value and line space provided of the question to guide how much you write for each answer.
- Attempt ALL questions in the exam. If you get stuck on one, move on and leave some time to come back and attempt to answer any leftover questions.
- Use the reading time wisely to plan answers in your mind.
- Use some time to prepare for any extended response questions when writing time commences and jot down some key points to help you structure your essay or report.

School Banking update from Commonwealth Bank

Even though this is a sad time, School Banking has taught so many young Australians, past and present, the value of money and we believe this should be celebrated. 

Specialist Drama

Students get their first experience of Specialist Drama in Year 3. Drama is a fantastic way to explore and develop important interpersonal skills through creative play. Throughout Term 3, the focus was on Non-verbal Communication through the performance style of Mime.

Did you know that every movement you make can be put into the movement styles of Mime? The easiest ones to work out are Freeze, Snap and Flow. Short direct and quick movements are Snap, and the more smooth and indirect movements are Flow.

Each student was given a 'Mime' box that they needed to take care of and bring to lessons. This box allowed them to show their skills in showing surfaces and weight to make a mimed object believable. Our work on Mime culminated in a performance of a 'Flea Circus.' Students watched a short film clip of Charlie Chaplin being a ringmaster to his flea circus. Using the clip as a starting point, in small groups they developed their own circus routines making sure to use their eyes and movements expressively.

Now in Term 4 we are learning about Greek Chorus and how to speak and move in unison. The Greek Chorus had a very important job to do. They were the narrators of the play being performed. We are working towards creating a performance based on a Greek Myth. Each class has been divided into small groups and given part of the story. Their task is to write and perform five lines that clearly tell the narrative of their section. We look forward to the finished product in the coming weeks.

Remembrance Day

In Assembly this week we had the opportunity to reflect and think about war and its consequences, the damage it causes, and the suffering to families and friends. We paid our respects to the Servicemen whose lives paid the ultimate price for our safety and the lives we live, as observed by Remembrance Day. Student cadets, Josh Wilson, Mackenzie Carey, Oscar Cuisick, Lucy Schiebel, Oscar Carey, and Matilda Willson were a credit to their uniform.

The Last Post was a truly haunting reminder of War. Our guest speaker Squadron Leader, Alan Robertson gave us a concise speech which included a history of World War 1 and the part young Australians played in this conflict. The guns stopped on the Western front at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month in 1918 and that this is a day remembered all over the world. It was a meaningful speech concluded with a poem between a mother and child and the meaning of war.

Ms Gilligan then spoke to us about war today, and how it affects children and told the story of a small girl in Afghanistan, a two year old left starving because of the conflict. A stark reminder of current warfare and the hope that none of our students will ever have to face this horror. The Squadron Leader and our K-6 Captains Daisy Linclon and Zac Pfizner laid wreaths and the Australian flag. A truly moving service.

Learning in Prep B

It has been a very busy start to Term 4 in Prep-B. We have had the Asian Festival, Athletics Carnival, Halloween Dress-Up Day as well as a School P&F Silent Disco.

In class, we have been busy at work. We have been developing personal attributes such as being cooperative, kind, resilient, sharing and teamwork. This has been exciting and at times challenging, especially when having to take on specific roles in groups and allowing others to lead.

In English, we have looked at certain books to illustrate these concepts such as: 'It's Mine', 'The Lion and the Mouse', 'Shhhh We Have a Plan', 'Giraffes Can't Dance' and 'Stuck'. Using these books, we have discussed, acted out, done STEAM activities and written about the personal attributes that each of these books have demonstrated. 'It's Mine' was a particular hit, with how selfish the frogs were at the beginning of the story and 'Shhhh We Have a Plan', made us laugh out loud at how bad teamwork and organisation can let a small bird keep getting away. These personal attributes were also reinforced and integrated into our Math's over the last few weeks with students having to work cooperatively to complete tasks in relation to concepts such as capacity and number. We played a lot of games and did a lot of hands-on teamwork to gain a better understanding of addition, subtraction, capacity and shape.

LEARNING IN FOCUS 7-10

Athletic Development

During Athletic Development in 2021, students have spent time developing their personal fitness, while learning about the theory behind quality training programs and nutrition.

Throughout Term 1, students focused on developing their aerobic fitness through various types of training, while also learning the theory behind other fitness components and how to improve them.

During Term 2, students were fortunate enough to have Joey from Unracked Strength and Conditioning Gym, teaching them who to complete a wide range of lifts using barbells. The focus during this was on safety and technique, with all students being able to coach one another through successful and safe lifts. While Joey was attending our practical classes, during our theory we were studying the importance of nutrition to fuel individual athletes. Students looked out how the kilojoule requirements differs from person to person and this is heavily dependent on their training regime.

Semester 2 has seen students learn about the components of successful and effective training programs. Students were placed into pairs and allocated a fitness component; from there, students developed a 90 minute session plan based on their component that they would then deliver to the class. This assessment not only challenges students but encourages the to think creatively, work with others and be a leader amongst their peers.

Students have currently been delivering their planned sessions to their peers. We have seen some very creative sessions and students should be commended on their efforts.

Thank you also to the great crowd, including many Old Scholars, who came along to support the event.


Class of 2001 Reunion coming up
