
at St Paul's Catholic Primary School. Zoey and her family are very excited about commencing at Dominic next year.

# LEARNING IN FOCUS 7-10



## Year 8 Religious Education

In Year 8, students are introduced to a multitude of different topics in Religious Education.

Semester 1 takes students back to Ancient Judaea to examine the historical context of the Gospels. Students explore what life would have been like for those living in the time of Jesus, what food they ate, clothes they wore, and the ways in which they made their faith a central part of their daily lives. Students construct an in-depth presentation on one of the many religious and political groups who were active in this time.


Students then move to an inward journey as they examine the role of the conscience in making moral decisions. This involves examining what good and evil look like in the day-to-day lives of ordinary people and in the wider community. These concepts are examined in the light of some of the Social Teachings of the Catholic Church and the teachings of the Gospels. Students then choose a particular charity and discuss how the aims and functions of the charity works to promote human dignity, solidarity, and challenge poverty, inequality, and prejudice.

Semester 2 begins by returning to the Gospels. The unit for Term 3 shows students the harmony of the Gospels in presenting Jesus as a teacher and a challenger of social, religious, and political inequalities. Each of the four Gospels is studied in turn, before moving to a focus on the Parables Jesus told His followers. This focus examines the Parables in two ways. The first is to focus on Parables as a literary form which uses different story-telling devices. The second is to focus on what message Jesus is conveying through the Parable. Students choose one Parable and present a formal academic essay which discusses both components of a Parable, along with how we might take the meaning or the moral and apply it to a modern context.

The final unit for the year introduces students to the Sacraments of the Church. The Sacraments are integral to the faith life of the Church and the individual Christian, and students are taught about how the Sacraments follow the Christian throughout their lives. For many students, this is their first encounter with this vital part of the Church. Students are asked to create a visual promotion of one of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist) which could be used by a parish church.

Taken in part, each unit of focus in Year 8 Religious Education introduces students to key areas of study as part of the Tasmanian Catholic Education Office's Good News For Living Religious Education Curriculum. Taken in whole, the year offers students the foundational beliefs of the Christian faith, their origin, their application, and how they are continued through participation in community through the Church.
