
Progress of the Development of the K-2 Precinct

Dear Families,

Preparation for any COVID-19 Changes in Term 3

The Critical Incident Management Team gathered on Monday 28 June to discuss the rapidly changing landscape on the mainland regarding the spread of COVID-19 and the Delta strain, and the need for us to be alert and proactive in preparing for the possibility of a landscape change in Tasmania, should this occur for us. As an essential service, it is important that we are prepared in the case of being forced into emergency lockdown.

As we have seen over this past week, state governments have been decisive and acting quickly with no notice regarding lockdowns. Families and students at Dominic have been issued with a communiqué on Monday 28 June outlining what students and families need to do in order to prepare for an unforeseen lockdown.

As Ms Gilligan pointed out, the College is acting transparently, and we have not been instructed to go onto alert. All we are doing is ensuring that we are ready as much as possible should we need to enact our COVID-19 Plan. All students should now have received a device to take home for the holidays. These can be used for the upcoming Parent-Teacher-Student Interviews in Week 1 of Term 3, but also for learning in the event of a lockdown.

We continue to keep in our prayers our families and friends on the mainland dealing with lockdowns. Be assured that if there are any changes to our situation during the term break, we will inform all families with further directions prior to school commencing.

School Banking – returning in Week 2, Term 3

School Banking is back at Dominic College in Term 3 and will commence on Wednesday 28 July 2021. Our banking day will be every Wednesday.

For each weekly deposit made at school, students will receive a Dollarmite token. Once they collect 10 tokens, they can redeem them for a School Banking reward.

If your child has previously participated in School Banking, or has an existing Commonwealth Bank Youthsaver account, they can start banking straight away by bringing their Dollarmite deposit wallet to school on School Banking day and handing it in to their class teacher.

If your child has lost their deposit wallet, please contact your School Banking Coordinator or visit any Commonwealth Bank branch for a replacement.

NAIDOC Week and NAIDOC Assembly

NAIDOC Week 2021 will be held from Sunday 4 July to Sunday 11 July. Each year NAIDOC week grows in stature and depth of celebrations at community, state, and national level. It is an opportunity for all Australians to come together to celebrate the rich history, diverse cultures and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples as the oldest continuing cultures on the planet.

The NAIDOC 2021 theme is Heal Country! This calls for all of us to continue to seek greater protections for the lands, the waters, the sacred sites and cultural heritage from exploitation, desecration, and destruction. Country is what our First Nations People speak about like a person, sustaining their lives in every aspect- spiritually, physically, emotionally, socially, and culturally.

On Wednesday 30 June, Years 2-10 gathered in the Savio Centre for our annual NAIDOC Observance Assembly. We began the assembly by having a Smoking Ceremony as students and staff entered the Savio Centre. The smoke symbolised the need for us to be together with clean open hearts and minds to better understand, to accept and to invite us all to walk with the Aboriginal people of Tasmania in a movement for a better future.

A highlight of the assembly was our guest speaker, Mr Linton Burgess. Linton is an Aboriginal Tasmanian man who is committed to cultural connection and continuing the practices of cultural dance and music. Linton is also an expert in Aboriginal Heritage and the use of Fire and cultural burning in both caring and healing mother earth. Linton spoke about his cultural work on-country.

Dominic College Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP)

A RAP is a strategic document that contributes to advancing reconciliation by supporting organisations to develop respectful relationships and create meaningful opportunities with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

Dominic College intends to actively engage with the Aboriginal Tasmanian community, First Nation people, including our Aboriginal students. We aim to support our Aboriginal students' education and academic growth as well as support their personal and cultural development. to provide opportunities for our Aboriginal students to participate fully across our academic and non-curriculum learnings, including providing leadership opportunities

We proudly launched our RAP at the NAIDOC Assembly. The Dominic College RAP was a result of a Working Party group made up of teaching and non-teaching staff, parents, and students. Thank you to Angela Triffitt for leading the Working Party and working with Reconciliation Australia to have our RAP officially launched. The RAP will be uploaded to our website soon.

K-10 Term 2 Progress Reports

You will have received notification by email that your child's Term 2 Progress Report is available for you to view on SEQTA Engage. If you have trouble logging into SEQTA please send a message to parentportal@dominic.tas.edu.au. The E-Learning team will be happy to assist you.

The Term 2 Report represents a progress update for all subjects studied over Terms 1 and 2. Teachers have provided grades and written comments about your child's progress and strategies for improvement.

Parent-Teacher Interviews

This week you will have also received notification through email that Parent Teacher interviews will be taking place in the first week of Term 3. They will be held from **Monday – Thursday 19-22 July, 2021**. Individual teachers have various times available throughout this timeframe (including some mornings, afternoons and evenings) to suit parents. This is an opportunity for parents and carers to meet with teachers and discuss their child's Term 2 Academic and Expectations Report. Teachers have indicated on reports if a Parent/Teacher Interview is requested; however, all parents are welcome to meet with any of their child's teachers.

We will be holding interviews using the Microsoft Teams platform. Parents and students will connect online with the teacher in a video conference call using the student device and student log in. Teachers will initiate all Parent-Teacher Interview calls so we ask that students and parents make sure the student device is logged in and students and parents are ready to join the Microsoft Team Meeting when the teacher initiates the call. Operating these through the student device and student log in will ensure that the interviews run smoothly as most students have experience using Microsoft Teams.

Internet connection will be required for this to be successful. If you do not have internet, then the interviews can be conducted by phone or face-to face by arrangement with the teacher.

Instructions for how to use the Schools Online Booking System (SOBS) will appear on the Dominic Website as well as the link to access SOBS.

SOBS is open for parents to make bookings from **Thursday 1 July** and until 5.00pm on **Friday 16 July**.


Commerce

In Commerce this semester, students have gained an overview of a variety of aspects of the economy and financial concepts. Students have investigated the laws of supply and demand, the significance of International Trade Agreements, and have created a brand identity around a fictional product or company. Students have excelled at working

independently to produce their own knowledge, most notably through a Genius Hour project, which offers them an opportunity to choose a topic they are passionate about and take ownership of their own learning. The Genius Hour project lasted for several weeks through Term 1 and included a planning, research, and publishing or presentation phase. Some of the topics that students explored included the steps required to start a small business; the importance of the aviation industry; an investigation into copyright laws; and several analyses of sporting clubs as a business model. The presentations at the conclusion of Term 1 were well-researched and insightful pieces of work.

During Term 2, students had the opportunity to participate in the Australian Stock Exchange challenge, in which they were given a hypothetical \$50 000 to invest in shares from the ASX200 index. Students relished the opportunity to compete with students around Australia, and learned some difficult lessons about the risks involved in investing in the share market!

Many studies show the positive benefits of spending time in nature for both mental and physical health. Time in nature or sometimes known as 'green time' can mean different things for different people.


What ways could you increase green time with your family?


