Dear Families,

Passing of Fr Lawrie Moate SDB

We received the very sad news late last week that Fr Lawrie Moate SDB passed away at Cabrini Hospital in Malvern, Victoria on 21 September. Fr Lawrie joined the Salesians as a Novice in 1960, was professed as a Salesian in 1961, and ordained as a Priest in 1971. Fr Lawrie had a long association with Dominic College and the Glenorchy community having worked as Deputy Principal of the Middle School (Year 7-9) from 1973-1982 and then as Parish Priest from 2010-2018. A requiem Mass took place at St Margaret Mary's Catholic Church in North Brunswick on Wednesday and Fr Lawrie was laid to rest in a funeral service at the Salesian Cemetery on the grounds of Salesian College Sunbury following the Mass. Please pray for Fr Lawrie, his family and all his brothers and friends in the Salesian community.

Don Bosco, founder of the Salesians used the Oratory as a place where the young would gather to learn, to pray, to care for one another and to play. next term as we prepare for 2023. My thanks to all members of our community for your contributions to the development of this important work.

Bravehearts

Recently our Kinder – Year 2 students had the opportunity to watch the 'Ditto's Keep Safe Adventure Show' which is presented by Bravehearts. This is a fun and interactive show that teaches children essential personal safety skills and knowledge using age appropriate language, song and dance.

Our Kinder – Year 2 students view this performance each year, as we want these messages to become part of their everyday language. We know that repetition of personal safety strategies with young people helps them to retain these skills and information. The show also helps to support students in developing self-esteem and resilience.

The performance is underpinned by the following principles:

- *Differentiating 'yes' and 'no' feelings*
- *Recognising the bodies 'warning signs'*
- *Body ownership*
- *Helping children identify language and feelings associated with secrets*
- *Reinforcing that there is no secret that children cannot tell someone*
- *What to do if you feel unsafe or unsure*

Students also learn 'Ditto's 3 Rules', which are:

- *We all have the right to feel safe with people.*
- *It's ok to say NO if you feel unsafe or unsure.*
- *Nothing is so yucky that you can't tell someone about it.*

Our students really loved the show. Following the performance, students unpacked some of these messages in their classroom and all received their own Ditto's Keep Safe Adventure activity booklet to help them review these key messages.

The Benefits of School Camps and Immersive Learning

During their time at Dominic College students have the opportunity to be involved in a variety of school camps, offsite excursions and immersive learning opportunities. These experiences are not just a whole lot of fun but are also invaluable

in developing learning and positive personal attributes.

Camps, excursions and immersive learning experiences are an important part of the learning for all students at Dominic College. These types of activities support quality curriculum delivery and can provide important social and emotional development opportunities that are not always available in the normal classroom setting. Through these experiences students have the chance to develop their teamwork, resilience and confidence-building through challenge, problem-solving, connecting with nature, creative and imaginative play. They are also able to develop their coordination and strength.

This term has included a wide range of immersive learning experiences for our students. Year 2 and Year 3 extended their scientific knowledge with visits to the Botanical Gardens and the Tasmania Museum and Art Gallery (TMAG). Years 4, 5 and 9 had camp experiences that helped them consolidate their learning, build relationships and develop their outdoor skills. Year 6 have spent the week applying their understanding of democracy and government as well as developing the art of persuasion during Not Canberra Week. Year 8 saw their learning from History and Geography come to life while enjoying the Polynesian Hangi. K-2 experienced a science showcase event to celebrate National Science Week. This involved students viewing the classroom learning, the experiments that had been conducted and completing some hands-on activities in each year level across the pulana precinct.

We hope our students walk away from these kinds of learning experiences knowing how to work through a challenge, stretch past their fears, trust themselves, challenge their thought and feel more capable of achieving their goals.

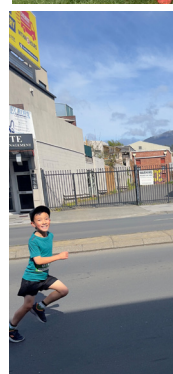
Term 4 Sport

Changes to Parking and Drop-Off Zones

Dear Families

During the upcoming school holidays the College will commence work on the new bus turning circle. This important piece of infrastructure will see the current bus zone completely upgraded to a more contemporary design that will improve bus and pedestrian access with a focus on safety for members of the community.

To ensure that the works are completed as efficiently and safely as possible we will be stopping all cars from proceeding past the current 3-6 carpark between 8.00 - 9.00am and 2.00 - 3.30pm. School buses will now proceed past the 3-6 carpark and use the angle parking adjacent to Grantleigh for student pick up and drop off.

Outside of these times there will be provisions for vehicles to drive up to the Business Office (Grantleigh), however, the use of angle parking will be prohibited at all times.

From the commencement of Term 4 2022 students can be dropped off in the current K-2 and 3-6 carparks and use the paths to walk to any of the precincts within the College. We understand that there will be some inconvenience whilst this important project is undertaken, we do ask that members of the community remain patient and drive safely.

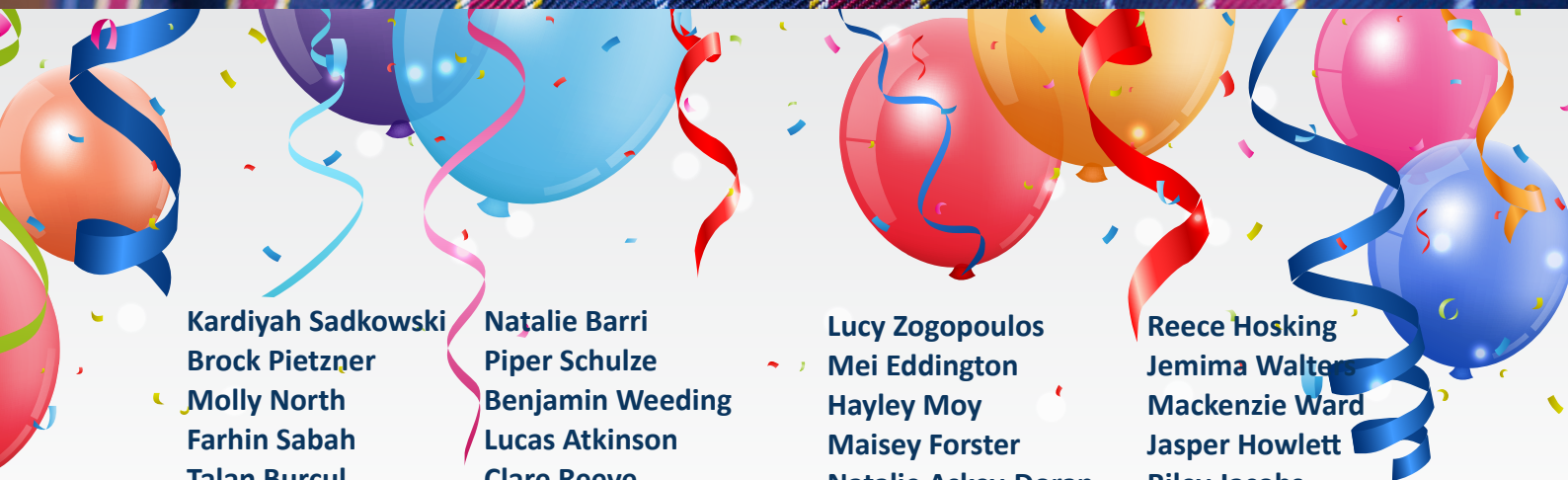
