Absences/Illness

In the event that students and/or parents and carers have prior knowledge of a student's inability to attend, they must request leave via a letter addressed to the Deputy Principal explaining the nature of the leave.

If a student is unwell on exam day, families must contact the College prior to 8.35am. Students must return to school with a Doctor's Certificate or a Statutory Declaration if they are absent from an exam due to illness. Students should present these documents to Ms Eddington on the morning they return and be ready to sit all exams missed while away.

Sacramental information from St Therese's Moonah

An introductory session for parents and carers was held at St Therese's School Hall, 24 Hopkins Street, Moonah, on Tuesday 16 May. During this introductory session the Sacramental Team outlined the process of preparing for Confirmation, answered questions, and provided an opportunity for parents to enrol children.

Following the introductory session, there are three preparation workshops for children, their sponsors (where possible) and their parents and carers. These sessions, held on the Sunday 21 May, 4 June and 18 June will begin in the Church with the 9.00am Parish Mass and continue in the St Therese's School Hall from 10.15am until about 11.15am. During the Mass on 21 May, the families will be presented to the Parish, and the children who become candidates will receive a crucifix which they are to wear to each Sunday Mass and Workshop through to the completion of Initiation.

On Sunday 28 May, we will celebrate Pentecost Sunday, the Feast of the Holy Spirit, which links with Confirmation. We like to invite our candidates to wear something red that day at the 9am Mass and we will celebrate and bless them in anticipation of their Confirmation. We will have a practice for Confirmation in the Church on Thursday 22 June at 5.45pm sharp. It's important to have the sponsors at this point. Then on that same evening the Archbishop will meet with all the children, their sponsors, parents, carers and team at 6.30pm in the Church. Learning and Curriculum - Year 4

Last term, Year 4 completed their novel study on 'Storm Boy' written by Australian author, Colin Thiele. The story was of a boy who developed a close friendship with a pelican named Mr Percival and battled with the ethical hardships of growing up in rural South Australia. At the end of the novel study, Year 4 gathered as one to watch the movie and compare the

differences between novel and film.

Year 4 have now begun their novel study for Term 2 on Rowan of Rin, written by Emily Rodda. It is a fantasy novel and is the first book of the Rowan of Rin series. It follows the adventure of a shy boy named Rowan who lives in the village of Rin. Students are introduced to an array of characters that will challenge their idea of what strength and resilience is.

Students made some great predictions prior to beginning the novel and are continuing to broaden their vocabulary with learning unfamiliar words such as 'disdainfully' and 'writhing.' Students have enjoyed finding synonyms and antonyms for these words. Emily Rodda has introduced us to her own neologism when referring to the 'Bukshah.' Neologism was explained to students as a newly coined word or expression.

Year 4 have recently created their own maps of the village of Rin and have made these look old and weathered by tea staining the paper. Students are eager to solve the riddle of the mountain and follow Rowan as he finds the strength to save Rin!

Learning and Curriculum - The Arts

It has been an exciting and enriching time for our students in Creative Arts this week, with performances and exhibition visits for many senior students.

Year 9 and 10 Art visited MONA to experience 'Oceans of Air' by Tomas Saraceno and other important works in the collection. They learnt how to use the 'O' device, to read about ideas behind artworks and to save their tour for further research. The Saraceno exhibition comprised of ten rooms, most very darkly lit where students could contemplate philosophical connections between

different natural occurrences such as spiderwebs and star constellations. The exhibition also encouraged thinking about the impact of humans upon the Earth and its environmental sustainability. Students were also given time to visit the rest of the museum with a focus on key artworks by Australian and International artists. Many had not been to MONA before and all had a thought provoking and enjoyable visit.

The Senior Concert Band attended a lunch time concert at The Hedberg, Conservatorium of Music, for a performance by the UTAS and Southern Colleges Wind Ensemble. Under the direction of Simon Reade, the Ensemble performed works by Percy Grainger, Leonard Bernstein and Tasmanian composer Catherine Likhuta, featuring the French horn in the first movement of her work 'Vivid Dreams'. Our students were treated to brass fanfares, trumpet solos, impressive section playing and even a harp. The thrilling performance and state of the art technology of the Hedberg Theatre inspired our young musicians and left a lasting impression.

The Valdocco Choir performed at Stoneman's Garden Centre as part of their annual 'Australia's Biggest Morning Tea' event. This event is a fundraiser for the Cancer Council, and it was an honour to be invited to perform. The students performed three pieces- 'Pie Jesu', 'Eternal Flame' and 'Help!', and were warmly received by the audience. Our College

Captain Priyannika Kumrai, spoke at the event, in tribute to our former student Ella James who bravely battled cancer for many years. We look forward to future collaborations with Stoneman's for this event.
