### Passing of Staff Member – Leesa Baker

As informed by our communique, sadly on Tuesday, 6 June our colleague and dear friend Leesa Baker, lost her courageous battle with cancer. Leesa worked as Learning Support Assistant in both our Primary and Secondary areas during the past six years, and was an Old Scholar of the College. She was also an active member of the Parents and Friends Association, President of the Dominic Old Scholars Association and an active sporting coach and mentor on so many levels.



Our College Chapel has been open to allow students and staff alike to visit to light a candle and for quiet reflection and prayer. A beautiful Mass was held for staff on Thursday evening and presided over by Fr Bernie Graham. The tranquil space of our Chapel was awash in candlelight as we gathered to support each other and to honour Leesa's generous spirit. Our students expressed their love for Leesa by writing prayers, designing butterflies and sharing stories of their memories of Leesa.

We offer our deepest and sincerest condolences to Leesa's family. She will remain in our hearts forever and we will include a plaque dedicated to her on our Memorial Wall in the Mary Help of Christians Chapel during our All Souls Day Mass in November this year.

Leesa's funeral will be held onsite at Dominic College Mary Help of Christians Chapel tomorrow, Saturday, 17 June at 10.30am.

## Creative Arts Captains Report

We are nearing the end of Term 2, and plenty of opportunities have opened up and taken place within the Creative Arts at Dominic College.



We recently had the Talking Heads production take place in the Oratory Space. Talking Heads is a drama production aimed at Year 9/10 students but also caters for younger students via the co-curricular opportunity commonly known as the Drama Club. This event occurred on 1 June, from 6-7pm. Rather than performing one play, each student learnt, memorised, and presented an

individual monologue (a speech performed by one singular actor, which is often used as a way for a character to express their thoughts out loud). In particular, one student named Lucas Pyke, performed an act called: 'Todd', which is based on the story known as 'Pterodactyls'. It was about Todd, presenting the creation story. The problem was that Todd had forgotten his notes, and had to improvise the story! Todd manages to tell most of the story without the assistance of his own notes, except he gets stumbled on one pivotal event, and has to remember what happens, or else the audience will never find out! Todd eventually remembers, and is able to successfully tell the story while overcoming the difficult challenge without notes. Lucas Pyke mentioned that Talking Heads was a great production which allowed him and his peers to express themselves, and perform to a proper audience, which has benefited him as he can further develop his acting skills, practice memorising lines, and performing in a theatre production.

The Creative Arts team has introduced the Student Photography Competition for Year 3-10 students. We are excited to see what students create, as it is an excellent opportunity to get involved within the Creative Arts aspects of our community. The competition is held as part of the Creative Arts Festival, as student submissions will be presented at the Moonah Arts Centre. There will be a maximum of two entries per student, and we present three categories as options for students. The categories include: black and white, portrait, and open/free. There will be six winners spread across Primary and Secondary students, and prizes allocated to the top photos. We encourage all students to give the competition a shot as it allows students to express themselves through their very own creations, as well as showcasing their photography skills to the community. A reminder that the entries close 18 August. We have created a Microsoft Form for submissions, which can be found on the student notices. Students should keep a lookout for the posters with information on the competition scattered across the school, and we encourage them to read them as they provide the essential information. LSAs support Year 7-10 students in a number of ways both within classrooms and in small group intervention settings.

- MacqLit literacy intervention groups are run for selected students in Years 7 and 8 requiring targeted remedial literacy support.
- Flourish Program is run for selected Year 7 students requiring targeted support with social, communication and organisation skills.
- LSAs provide assessment support for eligible students, including reading exam/test questions and scribing answers.
- LSAs provide support in the classroom alongside the teacher by assisting students with understanding instructions and providing reading and writing supports.
- LSAs provide additional learning and safety support in specialist learning areas.



### NCCD Update

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). They were able to analyse and creatively explore how Jesus interacted with his 'neighbours' and how he calls us to treat everyone today.

The Retreat had a strong focus on Service Learning and how we can give back to others. The Year 8 students have created a partnership with the Don Bosco Youth Centre in Fiji. Students were tasked with packing stationary supplies and writing personalised notes. In the coming weeks, the stationary packs will be sent to our fellow Salesian's in Fiji, and we can't wait to hear back from them!

The Year 8s were very lucky to have a visit from St Vincent de Paul Society and Loui's Van. Students were given a tour and learned about the amazing work that Loui's Van is doing within our community for those doing it tough. Year 8s then had an opportunity to cook meals that would be served directly from Loui's Van. In total, they cooked over 80 individual meals consisting of Spaghetti Bolognese, Minestrone, and bread rolls. Through this, students were able to experience authentic in-direct service learning.

Students concluded the day by writing reflective letters to themselves that they will get back on their Year 10 Retreat, and by having a closing liturgy reflecting on the key messages of the day.
