




#### **Annual Report**



However, the indoor activities and the Masses and the famous Dominic College salad rolls for lunch were able to go ahead as planned. As this is the 100th Anniversary of the arrival of the Salesians in Australia, at the Feast Day Mass we blessed and commissioned an olive tree for the occasion. We had hoped to plant it on the day but the wet weather intervened, but it will be planted on the Valdocco (Secondary) campus soon, and we will plant another tree in Term 3 on the Prouille (Years 3-5) campus to mark the 50th Anniversary of the commencement of Dominic College, when we celebrate our Dominican patrons.

### Learning and Curriculum

## Term 2 Learning Reflection

Just like Term 1, Term 2 has been a busy one filled with a wide range of events, learning experiences and

excursions. Some of the whole College events students have been involved in have included our ANZAC observation both at school and in the wider community, Cross Country, Walk Safely to School and the Feast Day celebrations for Saint Dominic Savio and Saint John Bosco.

In amongst all our events, excursions and retreats, students have continued to maintain strong routines for learning. Teachers have delivered high quality programs and worked to tailor learning to students' needs, interests and strengths.

Our Kinder – Year 2 classes engage in 'Story Book' lessons as a part of the InitiaLit and Pre-Lit literacy programs. Story books are rich texts that support the development of oral language, vocabulary and comprehension. Shared reading of these books introduces children to the joy of reading and storytelling and the children have just loved these lessons and exploring the selected titles.

Whole class novels provide a focus for literacy lessons but can also reinforce content from other subject areas like Science, History or Geography. Year 6 have been reading 'Boy Overboard' this term to build their background knowledge and understanding of migration and the migrant experience. This understanding has supported their learning in History where they have been exploring Australia's migration policies since 1901. In Year 4, the students have enjoyed reading 'Rowan of Rin'. Reading aloud to the whole class provided class teachers with the opportunity to model and reinforce the skills good readers use- making predictions, drawing inferences and summarising as well as vocabulary development. The students not only enjoyed the book but also the opportunity to share their thinking.

In Secondary school, students utlise a variety of reading skills on a daily basis. In Religious Education, Year 10 students read and analyse scripture and make connections with modern society. In Year 8 HaSS, students have been exploring informational texts on Polynesian history and culture to expand their knowledge and understanding. Year 7 English classes have been reading and analysing 'Trash' by Andy Mulligan reflecting on its themes of social justice and resilience. All reading tasks aim to reinforce understanding of specific topics or concepts, develop subject specific vocabulary and develop higher level reading skills. Additionally, students are encouraged to read outside of the classroom and can find a wide array of books, both fiction and nonfiction, covering various topics at the MacKillop Learning Centre.

The work done by students is reflected in the Semester 1 Academic Reports that will be released on SEQTA Engage next Thursday. Please take the time to look through the report with your child and identify areas of strength and areas for growth. All families are encouraged to make a booking with teachers during Parent Teacher Interviews being held in Week 2 next term.
